

## **IEP Eligibility**

The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act ensures that eligible children with disabilities receive free appropriate public education, including access to special education and related services.

To be eligible for special education and an IEP, an eligibility team, including a parent, must determine that:

- The student has a disability\*
- The disability adversely impacts their education
- They require specialized instruction
